Our biggest project that occurred over the course of summer was the complete remodel of our library.

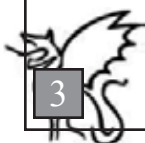

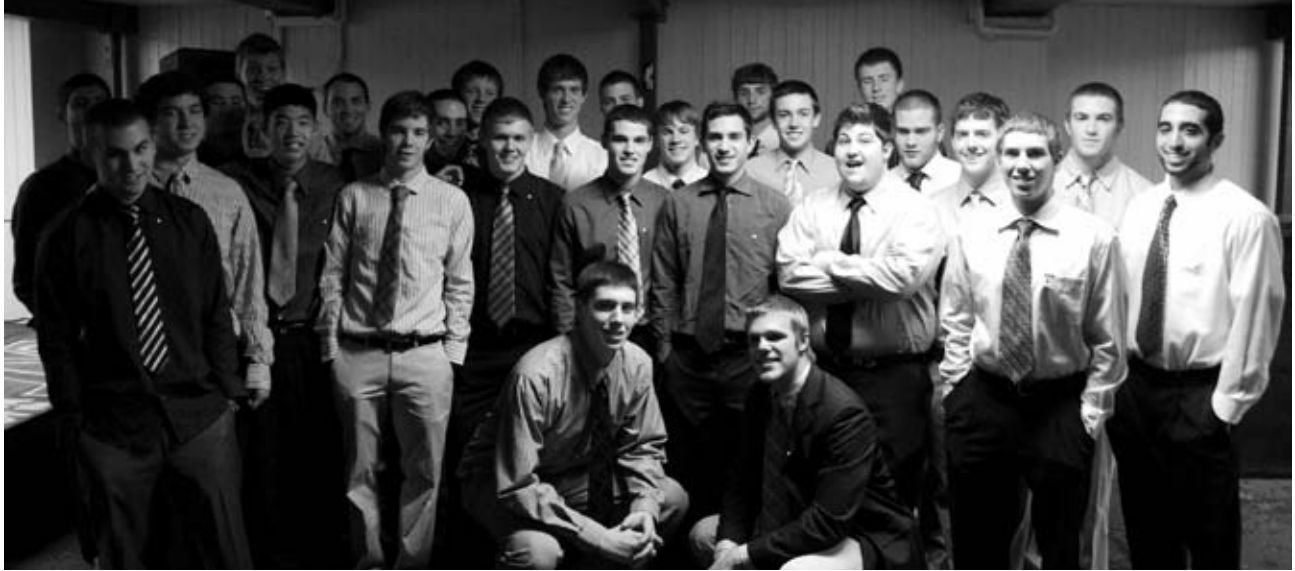
RAFT TRIP

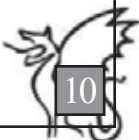
